The project involves construction of a facility that meets the Pesticides Control Board criteria for the storage, distribution, and sale of agro-chemical, animal feed, hardware, etc. to replace a small wood/zinc building the control board deemed unsafe and unusable for the intended purpose.

Los pequeños Agricultores y Ganaderos de Nago Bank Cooperative Society Ltd. Belize District, Belize \$15,000

This project entails building a central depot that will allow buyers to purchase farm harvest from the group. The depot will also serve as a central meeting space for the cooperative members.

#### Somali Bantu Community Mutual Assistance Association of Lewiston/Auburn, ME \$14,300

This project is led by the women who connected to the Mutual Assistance Association. They set the programming agenda which includes literacy programming, farming and basket-weaving. These activities will help empower the young women with skills for employment and better education.

#### Damayan Cleaning cooperative, New York, NY \$15,000

The ten women in this for this worker owned cooperative are members of the Damayan Immigrant Workers Association who need to find regular employment where they feel safe, respected and part of the community. The women will control and benefit from the cooperative. Four of the 10 women were trafficked in the past.

#### Wayside Outreach and Development Inc., Brooklyn, NY \$4,000

This group of senior citizens seeks to replace equipment and supplies lost or damaged during renovation; to provide training in arts, crafts and sewing to seniors to improve their quality of life.

#### Street Vendor Project, New York, NY

The project will assist project group members who are seeking to lift the cap on the number of street vendor licenses and permits from 3,000 to 6,000. Currently hundreds of street vendors are denied their own permit and are forced to lease licenses from those who have a permit.

#### Nobody Leaves Mid-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, NY \$15,000

Through its Peoples Power Campaign project, this group is seeking to shift the balance of power within the energy utility system towards low-income people. Group members believe all people need access to affordable and sufficient electricity, heating, and cooling. Presently, they are gathering evidence for a Public Utilities Commission Investigation.

New York State Youth Leadership Council, New York, NY \$15,000

This project is designed to make higher education more accessible and easier to navigate for undocumented students and others like them by providing better information/support

to students. It includes teaching university and high school administrators and faculty about undocumented student's needs and capabilities.

#### Equipping, Encouraging & Empowering Workers in Vredenburg, AL \$14,450

This project will assist underemployed and unemployed residents prepare for the workforce through test preparation and GED classes. More than half of Vredenburg residents live in poverty. The project will help group members improve their quality of life by being better educated and learning how to seek and keep jobs.

#### VEGGI Farmer's Cooperative, New Orleans, LA

This multi-ethnic farmer's cooperative grows fresh vegetables to sell to the public as well as grocers in East New Orleans. The cooperative members share equally in the work, liability and distribution of profits. The grant will assist the cooperative by creating sustainable income for the members through sustainable agriculture.

These women received training in peer to peer<br/>relationship building and counseling techniques and began support groups for other<br/>women incarcerated in the Los Angeles county jail and those recently released.Radio Indigena (Indigenous Radio Station), Oxnard, CA\$15,000

This project is a nonprofit community radio station which broadcasts in indigenous languages to serve the community in Ventura County. The group decides and works on topics for broadcasting, including indigenous music, cultural affairs, and social and political issues. Many members have been trained to operate the radio station and to be volunteer community DJ's.

#### **Community Tenants Association, San Francisco, CA**

focuses on empowering and organizing association members to make decisions about housing issues, public policy matters, and campaigns that directly affect them and their families.

#### King Capital Ent LLC/Recording Studio, North Randall, OH \$754

The grant will enable this low-income group to purchase recording studio equipment to produce music for events and performances it holds. The project will involve skills development and leadership and community engagement. It will also help generate income from developing music production products and the sale of merchandising items.

Urban Farmers' to Entrepreneurs, Cleveland, OH

\$3,016

This group of socially and economically disadvantaged farmers is seeking to purchase soil, seeds, and tools. Most urban farmers struggle to understand and address a mix of city permits and policies that affect their ability to garden or farm, which can lead to increased time and costs. It is often difficult to recruit banks to invest in start-ups. Having an indoor farming facility that allows individuals to grow in a 20'x30'x15' space year round using collective resources and having harvested rainwater will dramatically reduce the cost of operating for individuals and groups and increase their profitability. This opportunity demonstrates a tremendous cost saving for the individuals and the group.

# Synod of Lakes and Prairies

#### Tenant Coalition Training of Fargo-Moorhead Area, Moorhead, MN \$20,000

This group of low-income refugees seeks to become economically self-sufficient and to improve their financial skills. They will receive training in facility management, business plans, tenants' rights and microenterprise. Long term goals are aimed at sustaining their financial security, workforce development, and cultural marketing by preventing conditions that perpetuate joblessness, homelessness and poverty. The project will help reduce poverty amongst the group members and their dependency on public assistance and make the transition of living in a new country less scary and somewhat easier for them as new refugees.

#### Community Voter Registration Training, Moorhead, MN

\$25,000

The project is comprised of economically poor new immigrants that seek to advocate against the legislative and economic disempowerment of themselves and other immigrants, especially those residing in rural locations with limited resources. Group members seek to receive training in organizing and advocacy skills and thus achieve equity in jobs, housing, representation and development.

It will also be a hub for cultural awareness.

South Sudan Cultural/Language Camp, St. Cloud, MN \$1,839.05

This project is focused on language and cultural education and exchange between two generations. The parents will learn English and the U.S. culture. Their children will learn the Neur language and culture. This will help facilitate effective conversations between

the two generations, assist parents in interpreting at medical appointments, paying bills, completing job applications and securing drivers licenses.

The project is needed as it would provide a much-needed stress free opportunity for participants to focus on spiritual and life transformation in a home-like, inspiring setting. In addition to community building and specific workshops on self-development issues (examples: boundaries, interpersonal skills, employment, etc.), the entire event will provide a necessary opportunity for individuals under constant stress, and most in crisis, to have an opportunity to feel safe for a short, but extended period and to learn life skills and coping mechanisms for daily application.

#### Leadership for Social Justice Literacy Campaign, St. Paul, MN \$3,000

This project is focused on promoting literacy, fostering leadership development and promoting cultural awareness. The project will seek to engage students from marginalized communities.

# Wellness, Invitation, Relationship & Community (WIRCC) Center, Minneapolis, MN \$3,000

The project seeks to bring various communities together to build bridges of connection and mutual understanding. Project members believe relationships change assumptions and perspectives. Learning and teaching a non-violent form of self-defense builds a sense of personal power and authority, promoting mutuality. Group members are striving to build better connections between law enforcement and marginalized communities by encouraging personal health and well-being for all.

#### Glenwood Life Recovery Garden, Baltimore, MD

This project is phase 2 of a recently developed community garden in a formerly vacant, trash strewn lot in the Woodbourne McCabe neighborhood. It will include hiring of a part time project manager and employing neighborhood youth for the summer through Baltimore City Youth Works Program. The project also seeks to improve the land adjacent to the garden, selling the produce at the Govan's Farmers Market in the summer of 2017 and partnering with neighboring community associations to help with their greening or beautification projects.
