International Peacemaker visits have informed Presbyterians, opened hearts and minds, touched lives, and inspired new ministries since 1984. Apply to host an international peacemaker in your mid-council this Fall. Peacemaker schedules typically fill up fast — so don't delay! Applications will be accepted until July 1, or until schedules are filled.



- A. Argentina — Alba Rostan** is a member of the Evangelical Waldensian Church of Río de la Plata (IEVRP) and Administrator of the United Board of Missions (JUM), a ministry that accompanies the Qom and Tobas peoples in their struggles.
- B. Cameroon — Jaff Bamenjo** serves as Coordinator of the Network for the Fight Against Hunger (RELUFA), a Joining Hands partner of the Presbyterian Hunger Program.
- C. Costa Rica — Xinia Briceño** is an administrator of three rural aqueducts and a water-rights defender in the Caribbean region of Costa Rica.
- D. Cuba — Isett Samá Hernández** is an AfroCuban pastor with the Presbyterian-Reformed Church in Cuba and works with the Martin Luther King Jr. Center in Havana.
- E. Dominican Republic — Maria Bock Barrett** is an ordained minister and serves as Coordinator of Social Action for the Dominican Protestant Church. She oversees programs that transform lives in communities.
- F. Democratic Republic of Congo — Monique Misenga Mukana** is President of the Presbyterian Community of Kinshasa (CPK) Committee in Charge of Projects and serves with a non-profit Women Cradle of Abundance.
- G. Europe — Arlington Trotman** is an ordained minister and former moderator of the Churches' Commission for Migrants in Europe (CCME), an ecumenical body that advocates for migrants, refugees and minority groups.
- H. Myanmar — Thang Van Lian** is an ordained minister with the Presbyterian Church of Myanmar and a doctoral student at Columbia Theological Seminary.
- I. Palestine — Muna Nassar** is currently working with Kairos Palestine, a Christian Palestinian movement born out of the Kairos Document.
- J. Palestine — Muna Mushahwar Koussa** is the former co-moderator of The Palestine-Israel Ecumenical Forum of the World Council of Churches and a member of The National Coalition of Christian Organizations in Palestine (NCCOP).
- K. Russia — Artis Petersons** is a minister of Latvian descent with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in European Russia and currently serves a congregation in Moscow.
- L. South Korea — Moon-Sook Lee** is an ordained minister with the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK) and serves as Executive Secretary of the Asian Church Women's Conference.
- M. South Sudan — Lucy Awate Dabi** serves as a peacebuilder with RECONCILE International, the Resource Center for Civil Leadership, and affiliate church organization of the New Sudan Council of Churches.
- N. Zambia — Mabuchi Ndhlovu** is the director of community schools for vulnerable and marginalized children with the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian (CCAP) Synod of Zambia.
- O. Zimbabwe — Lydia Neshangwe** is an ordained minister with Uniting Presbyterian Church in Southern Africa (UPCSA). She is clerk of the Presbytery of Zimbabwe and founder of the Centre for Growth.
