Financial Aid for Service is excited to offer an opportunity for an all-expenses paid trip to the 2020 Ecumenical Advocacy Days gathering in Washington, DC.

Selected applicants will be given a \$1000 grant to cover travel, meals and lodging. Event registration costs will also be covered by our office. Awardee will be expected to attend both Ecumenical Advocacy Days and the Compassion Peace and Justice Training Day at New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C. After Compassion Peace and Justice Training Day, students will join the ecumenical community for Ecumenical Advocacy Days, April 24-27, 2020. Almost one thousand Christian advocates attend every year for a weekend of workshops, lectures and concrete actions addressing the ills of our nation. The weekend culminates in "Lobby Day" on Monday, April 27.

To be considered for this award students must respond to the below prompts by February 17, 2020.

Reflecting on the theme and scripture supporting the theme of the 2020 Ecumenical Advocacy Days National Gathering, found at [advocacydays.org/2020-imagine-gods-earth-people-restored/](http://advocacydays.org/2020-imagine-gods-earth-people-restored/), interested students should prepare a response, in 300-500 words, to each of the following questions:

- 1. How has your faith shaped your view of climate change and economic injustice? In your view, what responsibility does the church hold in addressing these issues?**
- 2. Where have you seen "the intersection of climate change and economic injustice" in your life or in the lives of those around you?**

To be considered for the award, students will prepare a response to both questions.

Submissions should be prepared on plain white paper, double spaced, with no photographs embedded in the document. The selection committee will select up to ten students for awards to be announced by February 21st. Financial Aid for Service will receive submissions and present them to the selection committee for consideration.
