Affirmation of Faith (from The Confession of Belhar)

We believe:

- that God has revealed himself as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people;
- that God, in a world full of injustice and enmity, is in a special way the God of the destitute, the poor and the wronged;
- that God calls the church to follow him in this; for God brings justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry;
- that God frees the prisoner and restores sight to the blind;
- that God supports the downtrodden, protects the stranger, helps orphans and widows and blocks the path of the ungodly;
- that for God pure and undefiled religion is to visit the orphans and the widows in their suffering;
- that God wishes to teach the church to do what is good and to seek the right;
- that the church must therefore stand by people in any form of suffering and need, which implies, among other things, that the church must witness against and strive against any form of injustice, so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream;

Invite the congregation to offer incarnational ways they might love and serve the Lord, and invite them into a time of prayerfully offering monetary gifts, or papers that give thanks for all God has done and the ways they are called to give back in service to the Lord; whether physically putting them in an offering plate, making donation via online giving tools, or prayerfully naming those before the Lord.)

Leader: God who creates and gives, we praise you! You have blessed us with resources and opportunities. We share these gifts that they may be used wherever there is need among our siblings in this church, in this community and throughout the world. Multiply them so they may be used to bring about Your reign-dom in Your time. Amen.
