- A 12-hour antiracism training will be offered as a Big Tent II preconference in Indianapolis (location subject to change), June 30–July 1, 2011. A workshop on white privilege and another workshop on antiracism using PW's Becoming the Beloved Community resource packet will be offered during the conference. This is a joint effort of PW, offices in Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries and Compassion, Peace and Justice ministry areas.

- New fundraising strategies will be added to the funds development strategic plan, including approaching foundations and corporations for gifts, and implementing a Leadership Giving Program to secure \$1,000-\$5,000 gifts.
- A proposal will be presented to the Gathering Planning Team regarding the addition of a silent auction at the 2012 Churchwide Gathering. Synods will participate by donating items for the auction, and will be able to choose where the funds raised will be directed (Birthday Offering, Thank Offering or PW Mission Pledge).

Justice and Peace Committee (J&P)

Janice Takeda, chair

- The committee discussed the connection of Presbyterian Women to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW). We heard from those who attended in 2011 and began to plan for 2012. We discussed ways we can continue to support the work of the CSW, and how we can select and support the attendance of women who are particularly related to the 2012 theme: empowerment of women from rural areas.
- The committee also discussed the importance of sending participants to Ecumenical Advocacy Days in Washington, D.C., noting its benefits as a leadership development and advocacy training experience.
- J&P supports the ecumenical project Words Matter (www.wordsmatter.org) and will bring awareness of expansive language through *Justice & Peace Links* and a workshop at the CWG.
- PW and the PC(USA) have affirmed their support of the U.S. ratification of the UN treaty known as the Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW). Participants in the 2011 UN CSW highly recommended working on this issue and met with members of a coalition who suggested a postcard campaign. PW will print these advocacy postcards, to be signed at PW events.
- J&P continues to work on its informal communication tool, *Justice and Peace Links*. We have begun to use an e-newsletter format, and will work to expand our email network. We will work with synod reps to gather email addresses from synod and presbytery moderators and J&P members.
