Genesis 1:27

- So God created man in his own image,
- in the image of God he created him;
- male and female he created them (NIV).

Revelations 7:9

 After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands (NIV).

Revelations 7:9

 The scene before the throne shows that the image of God is visible in different nations, tribes, languages, and cultures.

Therefore,

- one culture reflects only part of the image of God so that
- we can learn more about God from people from other cultures who are also created in His image

What is God like?

- To better understand what it means to be made in God's image, we first need to understand who God is.
- We will look at one aspect of God as the Trinity—3 persons in 1

What is God like?

- ☐ Trinity—3 persons in 1
 - 1. God the father authority/decision maker
 - 2. God the Son the truth, the Word
 - 3. God the Holy Spirit guide into truth

3 views of the image of God

- □ 1. Father-In Substance
- □ 2. Son-In Function
- □ 3. Holy Spirit-In Relationships

The Father: In Substance view

□ the image in Substance is a basic human capacity (the will)
 i.e. aligns decisions with God, uses Biblical authority, chooses to depend on God

 □ reflects God the Fathers' authority

The Son: In Function view

□ the image in function takes responsibility for creation (knowledge & action), is God's representative, and takes dominion over creation

 □ reflects God the Son as truth

The Holy Spirit: In Relationship view


the image in relationships, demonstrates the fruit of the Spirit, Body of Christ, is guided by the Spirit, and loves one another in community

 # reflects God the Holy Spirit.

How are we like God—the Image of God?

- □ 1. Will (decision-making, authority= reflecting God the Father in substance)
- □ 2. Mind (thinking/responsibility for creation= reflecting God the Son in function)
- □ 3. Heart (interpersonal relationships, social responsibility = reflecting God the Holy Spirit in relationships)



A Model of Culture

- Differences (Structure and Power) age, gender, ethnicity/race, language, social or work status, color, wealth, history, etc. with individual identity
- Similarities (Community)
 cohesiveness through regular
 social activity and social responsibility
 with group identity




- ☐ Will=Individual choices (control)

Individuating CbJS

 Individuating people typically complain about anyone and anything that prevents them from achieving their personal needs, wants, or desires. They justify their actions with detailed explanations.

Institutionalizing

- □ Strong structure
- □ Eg. Germany, UK,
 US institutions, PCUSA and corporations



Institutionalizing Image of God


- ₩ill=Decisions follow system rules and policies interpreted by authority figures
- Mind=Truth/policies/rules of the system
- Heart=Individual chooses social
 responsibility

Institutionalizing CbJS

 Institutionalizing people typically explain that bad things happen because people do not follow the rules and do not normally expect changes to be made.

Hierarching

- □ Strong structure
- □ Eg. Asia (Korea, Japan,
 China, Indonesia, Philippines)
 Latin and African cultures



Hierarching Image of God


- ☐ Will=Top-down decisions by hierarchy
 (authority), tradition, upheld by consensus
- Mind=Truth defined by tradition
- □ Heart=Community defines social responsibility

Hierarching CbJS

 Hierarching people seek to gain consensus regarding their complaints about individuals who do not uphold community standards or who deviate from the norm. Community members put pressure on those who do not conform to traditional ways of doing things reinforcing the hierarchy.

Interrelating

- Weak structure
- □ Strong community
- □ Eg. Australia, Papua,
 Central Asia, Latin
 jungle cultures



Interrelating Image of God

- **Community decisions by consensus**
- Truth defined as equality
- **¤Community defines social responsibility**

Interrelating CbJS

 As community defined equality is the standard of right and wrong, people in Interrelating cultures seek to gain consensus regarding their complaints about unequal structures that prevent the equal distribution of goods.

4 Types of Cultures

 The strengths of each type are actually the weaknesses of the other types. What one type prefers, the other types do not prefer. As such the four types make up a whole and provide a fuller picture of the image of God.
