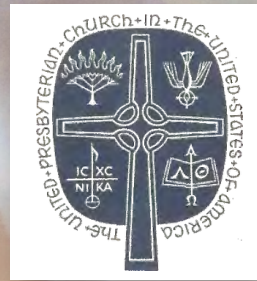


50 years of the Presbyterian Hunger Program

1969 PCUS launches hunger program



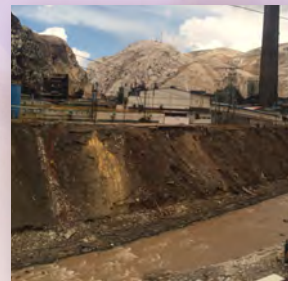
1975 UPCUSA launches hunger program

2002 PC(USA) votes to support Taco Bell boycott



2007 Eco-Palm project & West Africa Initiative launches

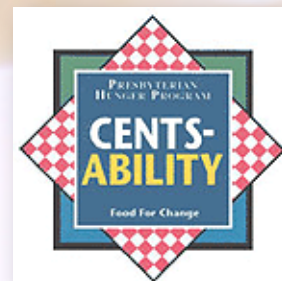


2017 Hunger Action Congregations initiative launches

1973 PCUS Women's Birthday Offering funds a Hunger Action Enabler (HAE) program and later commences work in 14 presbyteries



1976 Two Cents a Meal collection begun by Presbyterian Women



1984 PC(USA) sends millions in relief and development aid for the food crisis in Africa and influences Congress to allocate \$500 million in African famine relief



1990 PC(USA) passes "Restoring Creation for Ecology and Justice" policy



1996 PC(USA) passes "Hope for a Global Future" policy



2001 Presbyterian Coffee Project launches



2006 PC(USA) passes "Resolution on Just Globalization" policy and passes resolution to continue partnership with Coalition of Immokalee Workers



2012 Environmental Ministries, including the Earth Care Congregations initiative, becomes part of PHP
