CALL FOR APPLICATIONS: YOUNG ADULT EDITORIAL TEAM

Horizons, Presbyterians Today, and *Unbound* are coming together to publish a May 2014 collaborative cross-issue on young adults. But here's the kicker: this issue will be planned by young adults, edited by young adults, and written by young adults. Nothing like this has been done before in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), certainly not on this scale. And we want you to be a part of it.

A CROSS-ISSUE ON YOUNG ADULTS

In this collaborative issue, we will feature some articles in all three publications, while each magazine will also include unique articles that pertain to its subject matter (women, the denomination, and justice—respectively). And we're not just talking about written articles. We're looking for art, photography, video, music, poetry, and other creative forms of expression.

This issue will be a platform for young adults to share with each other and with other generations their vision for the church, their faith experiences, and the creative and innovative ways young people are already *doing* church. It will be a creative space for joy-sharing but also honesty and critique... a space you get to make your own.

THE EDITORIAL TEAM

We are seeking nine young adults (ages 18-35), representing diverse experiences, life stages, and perspectives, to serve as an editorial team, staffed by liaisons from each publication. This team will plan, edit, and execute the issue, while receiving valuable experience in publication development and new media. Editors will have the option of writing for the issue, but their primary roles will include:

- 1. Meeting at least once in-person and participating in monthly phone conferences;
- 2. Choosing the theme and sub-themes of the issue;
- 3. Calling for submissions and selecting writers/artists;
- 4. Serving on one of three sub-teams, one for each publication;
- 5. Assisting staff editors in the editing process;
- 6. Promoting the published issue; and
- 7. Developing a plan to continue the "work" of this issue after its publication (i.e. raising the voices of young adults and building up God's church).

Applicants should be able to demonstrate: a commitment to Jesus Christ and to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.); a history of ministerial leadership, particularly among young adults; a broad and innovative understanding of putting faith into action; a commitment to inclusivity and equal representation; and communication and organization skills. Experience in editing, publishing, and social media will be valued, but is not necessary.

Applications will be reviewed by representatives of each publication and of the Presbyterian Mission Agency young adult priority team.

In this way, our collaborative issue will serve as a season of listening to, and learning from, young adults—a priority set by the 2012 PC(USA) General Assembly. It will be a space for the prophetic—a space for asking (again, like Jeremiah) what needs to be demolished and what needs to be planted, as we seek to be a church "Reformed and always reforming".
